To help young people understand what happened at Pentecost and its relevance to their lives.

Bible Verses to CHECK OUT!

Genesis 11; Leviticus 23:15-22; Ezekiel 37:1-14; Joel 2:28; Acts 2:1-13, Acts 2:43-47.

REFLECT/PRAY:

Equipment: Bibles, red, yellow, and orange paper, scissors and pens & YOUTUBE clip

'After this, I will pour out my spirit on all kinds of people.' Joel 2:28

Peter quotes from this in his sermon in Acts 2:17.

Cut out flame shapes from the coloured paper and then write out the verse onto the flame. This flame represents the Holy Spirit.

People have always lived with the knowledge that fire should be treated with respect. It is a useful tool for warmth and light but is also to be feared if it gets out of hand. When the Holy Spirit came to the disciples at Pentecost, they saw what looked like flames of fire on each other.

This worship experience explores fire as a symbol for the Holy Spirit and enables us to contemplate two aspects of the Spirit's character - his empowering of us and the way he highlights where we need God to transform us.

As you listen to the song 'Holy Spirit', use this time to reflect on what you have learnt today. Ask God to help you to understand His word and experience the Holy Spirit in your own life, if you haven't already.
