To explore the parable of the unforgiving servant, investigating what it means to forgive and how this parable challenges my attitude to forgiving others.

Bible Verses to CHECK OUT!

Matthew 18:21-35, Colossians 3:13

RESPONSE/PRAYER:

YOU WILL NEED:

Paper, Pen, Envelope

Take the time to respond to the story of the unforgiving servant by writing a letter to someone you would like to forgive. You may choose to write a letter to God to thank Him for the forgiveness that he has shown you, or you may choose to write a letter to a friend or someone else to forgive them or ask them for forgiveness.

You don't need to send the letter, but it is a helpful thing to do to write it out and take that step of forgiving someone in your heart.

PRAYER:

Once you have written your letter it would be good to pray and ask God to help you forgive that person and to help you be more forgiving towards people from now on.

Pray in your head or out loud:

Dear God, thank you that you sent your son Jesus to die for my sins and to forgive me for all of my mistakes. I pray that you would help me to forgive (friends name) just like you have forgiven me and to love them like you do. Amen!

What's The Point? To provide a practical opportunity to respond to the message of the parable of the unforgiving servant in Matthew 18:21-35.
