JUST A SMALL AMOUNT OF FAITH

24.05.20 Session Aim

To know that with a tiny bit of faith there is the potential for great things. Also, that we never know what God might want to do with us and our faith, but we can trust in Him.

Bible Verse/s

Matthew 13:31-32, Mark 4:30-32, Luke 13:18-19, Luke 17:6

CRAFT - NATURE COLLAGE

Equipment: *Leaves, sticks, fir cones, items from garden or local park*

If you have a garden take the children outside, or collect things from the local park such as leaves, sticks, fir cones etc. Then ask the children to make a collage that represents them using the items. They could create a picture of themselves or something that represents them. If they have drawn something that represents them, like a hobby they have or a personality trait, ask them to explain it.

The Point: To help them reflect on who they are and lead into the story on how they can make a big difference with only a small amount of faith no matter how young they are.

ACTIVITY - YOUNGEST TO...

Equipment: *The PowerPoint resource on the children's page*

The resource is a list of world records held by children. Explain that you are going to read out the list of activities and the children must decide if the record holders were younger or older than ten when they won the world record. It would be fun to explain that even though they were older than ten, these achievements (Climbing Mount Everest, winning a Nobel Peace Prize) are things that many adults haven't done but that young people, who decide they wanted to, can do.

The Point: To recognize that children can do unexpected things.
